O R D E R

Counsel appearing for the two petitioners herein seek permission to withdraw these petitions with a liberty to the petitioners to approach the Bombay High Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, 1950, challenging the same actions as are subject matters of the present petitions. Pleadings in these writ petitions are complete but we feel that since the petitioners have efficacious alternative remedy, the same should be exhausted initially. Accordingly we grant liberty to the petitioners to withdraw this petition with a liberty to approach the High Court with an appropriate writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India. The pleadings of the present petitions here may also be considered as the pleadings in the Writ Petitions filed in the High Court and, therefore, copies thereof shall be placed on record. Since the pleadings are complete, we request the High Court also to take up the Writ Petitions for final disposal as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of six months.

In terms of the aforesaid order the Writ Petitions are disposed of with a liberty granted herein.

Pending applications also stand disposed of in terms of the aforesaid order.

It shall also be open to the petitioners to pray for an interim order, if any, by filing interim application, which if filed, could be considered in accordance with law.
