This petition is directed against order dated

26.5.2010 passed by the National Consumer Disputes
Redressal Commission (for short, "the National
Commission") whereby the revision filed by the
respondent was allowed and the order passed by the A.P.
State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission (for
short, "the State Commission") approving the direction
given by the District Consumer Redressal Forum,
Karimnagar (for short, "the District Forum") for
payment of Rs.2,70,800/- to the respondent with

interest at the rate of 9% from the date of complaint

till reliasation was set aside.

The petitioner has

also filed an application for condonation of 364 days'

delay.

We have heard learned counsel for the

petitioner and perused the record.

In our view, the

cause shown by the petitioner for delayed filing of the

special leave petition is wholly unsatisfactory and there is no valid ground much less justification for exercise of power by this Court under section 5 of the Limitation Act.

Even on merits, we are convinced that the reasons assigned by the National Commission for setting aside the order passed by the State Commission are legally correct and the impugned order does not call for interference under Article 136 of the Constitution.

The special leave petition is accordingly dismissed on the ground of delay and also on merits.
