**UPON hearing the counsel  
the Court made the following  
O R D E R**

- 1) Against an order of rejection of regular bail by the High Court and to seek bail, the present special leave petition has been filed. The petitioner is in custody w.e.f. 29.05.2024 in connection with FIR No. 62 dated 29.05.2024 for the offences punishable under Sections 21, 22 and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, registered with Police Station East Sector 26, Chandigarh.
- 2) After hearing learned counsel

for the parties, since the co-accused Rakesh Kumar has been granted bail by this Court *vide* order dated 20.04.2026 passed in SLP (CrL.) No. 3692 of 2026 and the case of the present petitioner is on the same footing, however, on the ground of parity, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, we deem it appropriate to release the petitioner on bail.

3) Accordingly, we direct the release of the petitioner on bail on furnishing the suitable bail bonds and sureties and on such other terms and conditions as may be deemed fit by the trial Court.

4) Petitioner to abide all the

conditions as imposed and shall regularly attend the trial until exempted by the Court. Violation, if any, may give a cause to take recourse as permissible and the trial Court is at liberty to do the needful.

5) Accordingly, and in view of the foregoing, the special leave petition stands allowed. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
