1. Delay condoned.

4. Appellant, who has been arraigned as an accused in the FIR No.97/2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 281, 125(A) and 105 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (BNS) read with Section 185 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (M.V. Act), is seeking for grant of regular bail.

5. A complaint came to be lodged by Akshay Kumar alleging that his mother, his three year old daughter, his sister-in-law and her two year eight months old daughter were sitting on the doorstep of their house and at that point of time, the appellant driving his Ertiga car in a rash and negligent manner lost control and rammed the vehicle into the house resulting in two minor children sustaining grievous injuries and later on succumbed to their injuries. It was also alleged that two other persons were seriously injured.

6. The earlier bail applications filed before the trial court and the High Court, did not yield any result to the appellant. In fact, this Court by order dated 06.10.2025 had dismissed the application for grant of bail as withdrawn. Thereafter, the witnesses have been examined and the complainant PW-1 has supported the case of the prosecution.

7. Taking all these aspects into consideration, the learned High Court by the impugned order has rejected the bail application, which cannot be found fault with at this stage. As such, we request the trial court to expedite the trial preferably within six months.

8. Hence, appeal stands disposed of.

9. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
