The petitioner is the wife of the respondent. The petitioner is now staying at Ananthapur in Andhra Pradesh with her parents. The respondent has filed two proceedings before the Family Court at Bangalore and the petitioner seeks transfer of those proceedings to the Court at Ananthapur, as she cannot defend the case at Bangalore, due to her financial problems.

Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner. The respondent, though served with a notice, has not chosen to appear.

Having regard to the facts of the case, we direct transfer of MC Petition No.1845/2008 and G & WC NO.5 of 2008 both titled as K.Sreenivas Vs. Smt.Neeraja Kumari, pending before the Family Court at Bangalore to the District Judge at Ananthapur. He may try the case himself or assign the same to the Court of competent jurisdiction.

The Transfer Petitions are disposed of accordingly.
