It is pitiable state of affairs in our country that eviction suit filed in the year 1990 is still pending in the Trial Court. In view of this, Trial Court is directed to fix a peremptory date for taking up hearing of the suit on which day hearing must commence and the same should ordinarily continue on day-to-day basis. No unnecessary adjournments should be granted to any of the parties. All attempts made by the tenant to delay disposal of the suit shall be defeated.
