The application filed by the petitioners for permission to file the special leave petitions is allowed.

Delay condoned.

The application for substitution is allowed.

The application for deletion of the name of petitioner is allowed.

Feeling dissatisfied with the increase in market value of the acquired land from Rs.225 per square yard to Rs.805/- per square yard, the petitioners have filed these petitions against the

judgment of the learned Single Judge of Punjab and Haryana High Court.

After arguing the case for some time, learned counsel for the petitioners made a request that their respective clients may be permitted to withdraw the special leave petitions with liberty to seek review of the judgment under challenge.

The request of the learned counsel is accepted and the special

leave petitions are disposed of as withdrawn with liberty in terms of the prayer made.

However, it is made clear that the liberty given to the petitioners to seek review of the impugned judgment shall not be treated as a mandate of this Court to the High Court to entertain the same and the review petitions filed by the petitioners shall be considered and decided on their own merits.
