ORDER

During the pendency of these transfer petitions, the parties have arrived at an amicable settlement and Memorandum of Understanding dated 7.2.2009 has been signed by the parties. The same is taken on record.

The detailed terms which have been incorporated in the Memorandum of Understanding would be part of this order. Both the parties are present in the Court and they have stated that they have amicably settled the matter and would abide by the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding. The parties pray that all proceedings between the parties be quashed and a decree of divorce be granted by mutual consent.
