O R D E R

1. The present Transfer Petitions have been filed for transfer of the following proceedings:

- i) H.M.A./Matrimonial Case No.1296 of 2025, titled "*Atul Vardhan Sarraf vs. Ananya Soni*", pending before the Court of the learned Principal Judge, Family Court, Gautam Buddh-Nagar, Uttar Pradesh to the Court of the learned Principal Judge, Family Court, Sawai Madhopur, Rajasthan; and
- ii) Guardianship Petition No.163 of 2025, titled "*Atul Vardhan Sarraf vs. Ananya Soni*", pending before the Court of the learned Principal Judge, Family Court, Sawai Madhopur, Rajasthan to the Court of the learned Principal Judge, Family Court, Saket, South District, Delhi.

2. As per the Mediation Report dated 07.05.2026, the Mediation *inter se* the parties is successful.

3. Learned counsel for the parties submitted that all the disputes and differences between the parties have

been amicably resolved, and the parties have decided to live together. Accordingly, appropriate and necessary orders may be passed in accordance therewith.

4. We appreciate the efforts put in by Ms. Indu Kaul, learned Mediator, Supreme Court of India, and also learned counsel for the parties in helping the parties arrive at an amicable settlement. We also deeply appreciate the parties for taking the decision to live together.

5. The terms of the Settlement Agreement dated 27.04.2026 reads as under:

"i) Both the parties hereto confirm and declare that they have, voluntarily and of their own free will, decided to resume their marital life as husband and wife.

(ii) Both the parties undertakes to end the existing dispute and live together as husband and wife and maintained respect for each other.

(iii) It is further agreed between the parties that the Respondent-husband on 01<sup>st</sup> of May 2026 shall take his wife alongwith his son from lodging accommodation i.e. L-12 B Second Floor Malviya Nagar to his Govt accommodation l.e. Quarter No. G. Tower 184, Type II Quarters, Aram Bagh, Paharganj, New Delhi 55.

(iv) Both the parties undertake to give due respect to each other and maintain dignified behaviour towards each other and their respective families.

(v) Subject to the aforesaid terms, the parties have resolved all their disputes

amicably and have agreed that they will not have any further grievances against each other or their respective family members.

(vi) Both the parties undertake that there will be no interference of the parents of either of the parties in the family affairs of Respondent and Petitioner.

(vii) Both the parties have amicably resolved their disputes and henceforth have undertaken to lead their life peacefully without any differences.

(viii) Both the parties have agreed to take care of their son mutually and either of the parties will not take their child "SOHAM" without the consent of either of the parties.

(ix) Both the parties hereby undertake to full-fill all matrimonial obligations and responsibilities once the Respondent-husband brings back his wife on 01 May 2026 from today i.e. 27.04.2026."

**As agreed between the parties, as per paragraph no.2 of the Settlement Agreement, the cases mentioned therein, as described below, shall stand closed:**

"(I) Petitioner/wife has lodged FIR No. 32/2025 P.S. Mahila Police Station Sawai, Madhopur, Rajasthan.

(II) Petitioner/wife has filed Maintenance Petition No. 83-84/ 2025. Under 144 BNSS pending before Family Court Sawai Madhopur, Rajasthan.

(III) Petitioner/wife has filed Case No. 1033/ 2025 under D.V. Act, pending before the CJM Sawai Madhopur, Rajasthan.

(IV) Respondent's/mother has filed Case No. 2378/ 2025 under D.V. Act, pending before the JMFC, Suraj Pur Court, Gautam Buddh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh.

(V) Respondent/Husband has filed Petition Under Guardianship and Ward Act No. 163/2025 pending before Family Court Sawai Madhopur, Rajasthan.

(VI) Respondent/ Husband has filed Divorce Petition No. 1296 of 2025 pending before the Family Court, Surajpur, Gautam Buddh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh."

**6. In view of the above, the following directions are issued:**

**i) All the legal proceedings pending *inter se* the parties, as indicated above (paragraph no.5 herein), shall stand closed;**

**ii) It goes without saying that both the parties will continue to abide by the terms of the Settlement Agreement without any exception;**

**iii) The Registry is directed to forward a copy of this order to the fora/courts concerned for passing formal orders closing the cases;**

**iv) The terms of the Settlement Agreement are binding upon the parties. The parties undertake to abide by the same; and**

**v) The parties, through their learned counsel present in the Court, have been made aware of the consequences of breach of such terms, including the initiation of contempt proceedings.**

7. Accordingly, the Transfer Petitions stand disposed of.

8. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
