It is submitted by Mr. Maninder Singh, learned Additional Solicitor General that there are two ways by which the situation that has emerged in this contempt petition can be solved. One is to ask the Commissioner of Police to initiate proceedings under Section 82 of the Code of Criminal Procedure or to issue notice to the developers and,

thereafter, to proceed with the main appeal after recalling the order passed therein as it was an order passed on concession, which is disputed by the appellant.

In view of the aforesaid, let notice be issued to the respondent Nos.1 to 3, fixing a returnable date within four weeks hence.
