O R D E R

1. Heard learned counsel for the parties.

2. The High Court in exercise of its power under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure has refused to interfere with the FIR No. 383 of 2023 for the reasons recorded basically to the effect that whether the dissolution deed relied upon is a fictitious document is an issue which has to be decided on the basis of the evidence adduced by the parties.

3. In the facts and circumstances of the case, we are not inclined to interfere with the order impugned in exercise of our power under Article 136 of the Constitution of India.

4. The present petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
