O R D E R

The petitioners, who were employed from time to time as casual workers in the Indian Posts and Telegraph Department from 1979 to 1982, seek their regularization. The petition for

regularization of service was dismissed by the Single Judge for non-prosecution. On more than one occasion, there was always a belated application for restoration. Ultimately the LPA has been dismissed by the High Court on 13.11.2019 for the reason that the petitioner's application for restoration itself was filed belatedly.

Considering the entire period for which the litigation was pursued in the hands of the petitioners and even on the merits of the case, we find absolutely no reason for our interference.

The Special Leave Petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
