UPON hearing counsel the Court made the following

O R D E R

When this matter came up before us on 07.02.2014, learned counsel for the parties sought time to take instructions whether the parties are ready and willing to explore the possibility of an amicable settlement of all outstanding issues by way of mediation.

Learned counsel for the parties today submit that the parties are agreeable to mediation as a possible mode of settlement of all the outstanding disputes. In the circumstances and keeping in view the nature of the disputes, we deem it just and proper to refer the parties to Hon'ble Mr. Justice R.V. Raveendran, former Judge of this Court with the request that he may as Mediator help the parties to arrive at an amicable settlement of all outstanding issues.

The parties shall seek the convenience of Justice Raveendran for their first appearance before him preferably within two weeks from today.

We do not propose to determine the fee payable to the Mediator which part we leave to the Mediator to decide keeping in view the nature of the disputes and the time and effort involved in the conduct

of the proceedings. The fee shall be paid in equal proportion by the petitioners and the respondents. We hope and trust that the Mediator shall make a report to this Court as early as possible and preferably within three months from today.

This petition shall in the meanwhile stand over for a period of three months.

We make it clear that the mediation proceedings shall be without prejudice to the rights and contentions of the parties in this petition.
