Our repeated questions to the learned counsel for the

petitioner as to how he is interested person seeking to grant

special leave questioning this Order. The answer is in t
he

negative.

After perusal of the averments of the special leave petition, we find that the petitioner is not an aggrieved party, there is no locus standi for him to challenge the same before this Court either to seek permission or to seek for participation in the proceedings. This is, in our view, is a frivolous and vexatious petition. This kind of litigation shall not be entertained by this Court. We are of the view that the application for permission to file the special leave petition is liable to be dismissed with exemplary costs as the petitioner is wasting public time by initiating this kind of litigation.

Accordingly, we dismiss the application for permission to file the special leave petition with cost of Rs. One lakh to be deposited by the petitioner in the Registry of this Court within a period of four weeks, which is to be used for the cause of juvenile justice.
