O R D E R

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

It is brought to the notice of the Court that the petitioner was placed *ex parte* in the Restitution of Conjugal Rights Petition on 13.12.2019 and, ultimately, the *ex parte* decree was passed on 11.01.2020 against the petitioner.

It seems this Transfer Petition is filed with vague facts. The petition does not disclose that the petitioner was placed *ex parte* in the Restitution of Conjugal Rights petition before the Trial Court. Be that as it may, since the *ex parte* decree is already passed and, as it is brought to the notice of this Court that the petitioner has filed an application for restoration

of the *ex parte* decree before the Trial Court, I decline to interfere in the matter.

The Transfer Petition is, accordingly, dismissed.

However, it is open for the petitioner to move the matter again, in case the *ex parte* decree is set aside.

The application for restoration may be decided at an early date.
