UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1 On 29 January 2018, this Court passed an interim order in Writ Petition (Criminal) No 17 of 2018 (Rajesh Bangur Vs Union of India) directing that the proceedings be listed on 5 March 2018 and in the meantime respondent Nos 4

and 5 to those proceedings shall not remove the child from India.

- 2 Subsequently on 19 March 2018, the Writ Petition was dismissed. With the dismissal of the Petition, the interim order dated 29 January 2018 directing that respondent Nos 4 and 5 to those proceedings shall not remove the child from India has necessarily come to an end.
- 3 The child has since attained majority and the Court is informed that she is an Australian citizen who had come to India to visit her grandparents and, therefore, desires to go back to Australia.
- 4 With the interim order having ended with the dismissal of the Writ Petition, there would be no restraining order of this Court operating as a consequence of the interim order.
- 5 The Miscellaneous Application is accordingly disposed of.
- 6 Pending applications, if any, stand disposed of.
