O R D E R

In Item No.13

Issue notice.

Status quo, as on today, shall be maintained in the  
meantime.

The petitioner shall pay 75% of the dead rent as was  
being done and with regard to the remaining 25% the order of the  
High Court is stayed.

In Item 43

Issue notice.

In matters arising out of the same judgment, two  
different interim orders have been passed by the Court. In one  
case the order of the High Court was stayed and in another batch of  
petitions, this Bench passed an order of status quo. Both the  
orders have been passed in the special leave petitions. We  
therefore request the parties to give list of all matters to the  
Registry within 2 weeks from today and the Registry after obtaining  
instructions from the Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India place  
these matters before an appropriate Bench on 28.2.2020 so that we  
can decide what common interim order should be passed in all the  
cases.
