The petitioner who appears in person a a member of the Bar. He challenged the following order passed by the learned Additional City Magistrate by filing a Revision Application before the Sessions Court:

"25.02.2022 File presented. Called out.
Opposite Parties were present.

Lekhpal report to be presented
on 25.02.2022."

By the impugned order, the learned Sessions Judge rightly observed that the order dated 25th February, 2022 is not capable of being challenged as it only directs that the Lekhpal Report should be submitted on or before a particular date. We agree with the observations made by the Sessions Court. Therefore, no purpose will be served by permitting the petitioner to avail remedy before the High Court. Hence, there is no reason to interfere under Article 136 of the Constitution of India. The Special Leave Petition is accordingly dismissed.
